Washington County Health Care Resources



55% of surveyed Washington County residents identified health care insurance related problems, such as high health insurance costs and no health insurance, as **the number one health problem for Washington County.**¹

There is a conservative estimate of 5,681 Washington County residents without health insurance. Only 1,017 Washington County residents were enrolled in adultBasic as of June 2006, and 707 people from Washington County were on the waiting list.

Research has proven that people without health insurance for extended periods of time get sicker and are more likely to die sooner than people who have insurance.²
